Horse Show Reflections & What We Want Judges to Know

If you had the chance to tell the judges anything about yourself, what would you say? One Junior/Young Rider at the 2021 NCDCTA Capital Dressage Classic wanted to simply say this to the judges, "Thank you. I appreciate the chance to show and learn."

On June 5th & 6th, NCDCTA sponsored its first dressage show of the season, the Capital Dressage Classic, at the Hunt Horse Complex in Raleigh. Dressage competitors gathered to ride down centerline in front of judges Debby Savage "S" and Cesar Torrente "S" with the support of family, friends, and fellow competitors. The bleachers by the outdoor ring were often full and horses out for a walk joined support teams along the fence of the warmup ring. Spectators in the coliseum made up for their small numbers by loudly clapping and hooting after each ride. After a difficult year with empty bleachers and fence line spectators, this small exuberant group of spectators, the show management, and the judges made the riders and horses feel like superstars.

Horse show grounds are a flurry of activity from early morning until long after the last ride of the day. As dawn lightens the sky, horses are fed and taken on walks to stretch their legs. Throughout the day, muck buckets are filled and dumped, water buckets hauled to stalls, hay nets filled, tack is cleaned, and horses bathed. There is a steady parade of riders in pristine white breeches on immaculate horses going to the show ring and of red-faced riders and sweaty horses returning to the barn.

If you walk through the barns and around the show arenas, you start to notice the little things that make a horse show not just a venue to compete, but a community of family, friends, and fellow competitors gathered socializing and having fun.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the 2021 Spring Survey for the North Carolina Dressage & Combined Training Association.


We had 115 people respond to our Survey – We were very excited to get this response, consider it a success and a good start!

This month we are sharing the results of the first four questions with you. Look for more results in next month's newsletter.


The full results will be shared with the NCDCTA Board of Directors, and the information learned will be considered for future decisions and possible actions of committees.

Are you an active member if NCDCTA?




How long have you been an NCDCTA member?



Students proudly hang up banners or stall guards in support and recognition of their trainers and barns. Flowers adorn a table filled with munchies in the aisleway with a circle of chairs. Two riders hose their horses off and laugh when one horse grabs the end of the nozzle and shakes the hose, spraying water in the air. A trainer carefully adjusts the white stock tie of a young student. When a rider needs a horse held or a test read, there is always a volunteer. Friends sit in the aisle and tell stories while their horses hang their heads out of stalls demanding attention.

Riders of all ages and levels of ability chose to go down centerline with their horse in front of a judge who sees them for this moment in time. They judge them on their ability to execute individual required movements and the presentation of the correct training of the horse at the level being ridden. Judges get the chance to give riders feedback through scores and comments, but I wondered what competitors and their support teams would tell the judge if they could share some thoughts. So, I wandered around the show grounds taking photos and talking to everyone. The results were both hilarious and thoughtful.

In response to the judge who told a competitor to make better use of the corners, the rider wants the judge to know that she is riding a young horse, this is only her second show. Her horse is still scared of the judge, so "it is lucky we managed to stay in the ring." Another rider wishes the judge could have seen the warm-up because "we were fantastic in the warm-up!". Yet another rider wished the judge had seen her lesson the week before the show because "my trainer told me that was the best extended trot I had ever executed!" There are plenty of training level riders who all swear they can actually ride 20-meter circles that are not egg-shaped. There are plenty of FEI level riders who want to assure the judge that they know an 8-meter circle does not go to centerline. The rider who was consistently told that her horse was not immobile at the halt wants to let the judges know "the hind leg jazz step that my horse executes at the halt is his salute!" We all know that some of our best moments can happen outside the show ring when we are not under the pressure of being judged and our horses are in their comfortable familiar surroundings. Our challenge is to demonstrate the correct training of the horse and rider with an unpredictable animal in an unfamiliar environment to a judge who is seeing the horse and rider combination for one moment in time.

Spectators and support teams also had plenty to tell the judges. Riders who were not competing at this show were in the stands and along the fences having a great time watching. One of them commented that it was, "so relaxing and fun to cheer everyone one!" A daughter who grooms for her competitor mom wants the judge to

know that her mom "is the greatest and most incredible person I know. She puts her whole heart and soul into everything she does with horses." Another large support team wants the judge to "enjoy watching this small yet mighty partnership." A proud trainer is quick to point out that for her student this is a show of firsts: first show after her first baby boy (only four-months ago), first time showing this horse, first time showing second level, and first time showing in Raleigh. Horse show moms celebrate their junior/young riders and wanted the judges to know that they appreciate the supportive feedback. Another trainer who travels from Blacksburg, Virginia wanted to share how much she and her students love coming to this venue. There were many participants and spectators who noticed and appreciated the kindness and patience shown by the judges when a rider and horse combination needed support.

It is the little things that are important like the friend who showed up to cheer you on even though you have not seen each other over a year because of the pandemic. Our rides down centerline are only one ride and one moment in time of our journey learning the sport and art of dressage. As Elizabeth Hanssen (JR/YR) said, "The judges are here to help us and guide us on our journey. Thank you!"

Thank you for everyone who chatted with me over the weekend. Thank you to NCDCTA for sponsoring a show, thank you to the horse show management who did a great job, and thank you to the essential group of smiling volunteers. Thank you to James Hunter, farrier on the grounds, and the EMT's with the Western Wake Fire Department. Thank you to the vendors that came out, and yes, I did buy some bling this weekend!

Paying It Forward

One of the joys of my involvement with horses is sharing that love with someone else. Many people have shared their love of horses with me and helped me over the years with my dressage journey. This weekend at the Capital Dressage Classic, I was able to pay it forward to my friend Savannah Sheldon.

Savannah has been riding my Friesian mare Hillie. I mentioned to her that we could take Hillie to a show and try to earn scores towards her bronze medal. Savannah had ridden First Level in high school but has focused on hunters and developing her own horse since that time. She felt that perhaps she could try for her First Level scores. I looked at her and the extremely capable way she has been riding and told her that Second Level was also in the cards.

There is something relaxing about going to a show and not actually competing! Savannah packed the "beverages" and snacks for us, and we set off for Raleigh. When we set up, we made instant friends with the people around us and renewed friendships with others down the barn aisle. Everyone became the cheerleader for every rider on our end of the barn.

As there is never a rhyme nor reason with dressage test scheduling, the Second Level Test was the first test for Savannah on Saturday. This worked out to her advantage, as it was the harder test, and it was best to get it conquered first. I was able to step up as a groom to wipe boots, provide water and read the test for her. When she came out of her very first Second Level Test, having masterfully ridden the counter canter she secretly dreaded, I grinned at her and told her that I knew she could do it! When the scores were posted for Saturday, she had earned her first two scores towards her bronze medal.

On Sunday, someone turned up the outdoor thermostat and it was steaming and hot in the arena. Armed with buckets of water, electrolytes and liniment for the horse, and a bottle of water for the rider, we set off for a 1:18 PM ride time. Again, the Second Level test was the first ride of the day. The confidence that she gained from riding it the day before exuded from her. They rode up centerline with an attitude of extreme command. The smile on her face when she finished the test could have powered the electricity for the show grounds. That trip around the dressage court earned her a 71.216%. She still had one more test for the day, the final First Level Test. As they were both clearly on fire, they finished the day with a 72.069%. All First and Second Level scores towards her bronze medal were achieved.

As the groom and "horse show mom" of the weekend I was so proud that I could burst. I was able to help my friend achieve a goal that she had always desired on a horse that she is helping to develop. It was exciting to be part of someone else's journey.

NCDCTA Board Meeting 6/1/2021

The NCDCTA Executive Board and membership met via teleconference on June 1, 2021. President Amanda Miller called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM. Board members present were Amanda Miller, Amy Warren, Wendy Warner, Jessica Brown, Will Barrus, Tonya Bruno, Alex Martini, Rachel Edwards, Joan Hilsman, Emme Johnston. Deb Branson and Tyler James were excused.

VICE-PRESIDENT's REPORT: Joan Hilsman presented the membership numbers as of June 1, 2021:

Adult Amateur: 357

Paid Horses: 309

Jr/YR: 116

Volunteer Card Horses: 102

Open: 121

Total Horses: 411

Total Members: 597

There was a significant jump in the last month of people using volunteer cards. Joan noted that last month at the War Horse, Ellen Bradford jumped in to work the Club's NCDCTA table.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Wendy Warner reported that January brought about a \$3,800 loss because that is when HOY awards were purchased. She felt it is extremely difficult to compare 2021 to 2020 because there is no huge Gala expense. As such, the Club has more cash in January 2021 than in January 2020.

COMPETITION CHAIR'S REPORT: Wendy Warner reported that the Capital Dressage Classic is this weekend. Everything is looking good, including volunteers and arena setup. The show has 86 entries, and only two rings will be running due to construction at the facility.

COMMUNICATION CHAIR'S REPORT: Tonya Bruno reported that the survey had 115 responses with great feedback on what is important to Club members. Two responders won Amazon gift card raffle for participating. Tonya will send it out to the Board for review then it will go out to the Club membership. Additionally, the Newsletter masthead will change to a dressage rider with a helmet from a dressage rider with a top hat since top hats are no longer legal at the national level. Lastly, she has some volunteers to write articles on the previous show.

HOY GALA CHAIR REPORT: Jessica Brown is compiling a list of people who did not pick up their prizes from last year. They will all be contacted again. There will be two more opportunities to pick up prizes, and prizes must be picked up by June 30. She is excited to see the survey results to guide plans for the next gala.

JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDER CHAIR: Competition Chair Wendy Warner reported that one of the youth scholarship winners for CDC is unable to attend due to serious family health concerns. The Board opted to make her eligible to apply to other scholarships this year due to the extenuating circumstances.

EDUCATION CHAIR'S REPORT: Emme Johnston reported that she is working on setting a date with Michael Bragdell for an in-person clinic this fall.

EVENTING CHAIR'S REPORT: Amy Warren reported that there are some exciting prizes for War Horse. Jammie Hand at Equiprism has done a super job doing embroidery for us at reasonable prizes with a quick turnaround time.

Joan added that Will did a super job putting together an NCDCTA ad for the War Horse program detailing the benefits of Club membership.

The next meeting will be in person on July 6, place to be determined.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 PM.
